## Themed family park seeks heating

During the winter months especially, outdoor events can be intolerable for guests unless adequate heating is present on site. So when a large estate in Kent opened a Christmas adventure experience, they sought portable heating systems to keep guests warm between activities. We sent a local specialist to the site to conduct an assessment, and he ascertained that units would be needed for a marquee and a separate building.



Following his appraisal of the area, we delivered two indirect fire oil heaters – an ID65 and an ID35 – with these models regularly used for assignments of this type. They were selected because of their ability to deliver large volumes of warm air without consuming excessive amounts of fuel. Both units were deployed outside, with heat transported into the desired locations via separate lengths of ducting.



Our client was dependent upon a quick response to their enquiry as effective climate control needed to be in place before the grand opening. They were therefore delighted with the equipment we proposed, which helped keep families comfortable throughout the duration of their stay.
